

Parent/Carer/Pupil Conduct Expectations – March 2021

Returning to school in March will be a difficult experience for all involved; including pupils, parents/carers and school staff. To help make this as safe and productive as possible, the following expectations **must and will** be adhered to; failure to do so will result in further action:

- No pupil will be sent to school if anyone within the household is showing any of the symptoms of Covid-19. The main symptoms are:
 - A high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature).
 - A new and continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual).
 - A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you have noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.
- If anyone within the household is showing signs of Covid-19, or has tested positive for the virus; the household will self-isolate for the required amount of time.
- Pupils will be expected to wash their hands/use hand sanitiser on entering the building.
- Pupils and staff are recommended to wear a face covering at all times, including in the classroom. The only times that a face covering should be removed is whilst eating/drinking, during PE lessons or because there is an exemption.
- Face coverings will be a mask only, and never a scarf or bandana or the like. Anyone without a face covering will be provided one by school and a fuss will not be made in putting it on.
- Parents/carers and pupils understand the need to socially distance themselves where possible. This is particularly important during unstructured time such as break and lunch – and also during lesson time when pupils are not permitted to leave their class and join another.
- To reduce the risk of infection transmission; where possible, but regarding shirt/t-shirt as a minimum; clean/fresh clothes will be worn each day.
- Pupils will regularly be instructed to wash their hands/use hand sanitiser throughout the day – pupils will do this without any fuss or argument.
- Parents/carers will make sure that pupils do not bring anything to school other than the basic necessities – all items will be put into individual wallets by pupils.
- Parents/carers understand that should a pupil become unwell whilst at school, and show any of the Covid-19 signs; Chaselea staff will put the pupil into isolation (in accordance with Government guidance and recommendations) and emergency contacts will be contacted immediately to collect the pupil.
- Parents/carers will remind pupils of the behaviour expectations – particularly around spitting and refusing to follow instructions. Spitting is an example of disgusting and unacceptable behaviour at the best of times and will not be tolerated under any circumstances during these times.
- Parents/carers are not permitted to enter the building unless by previous appointment.
